

RoHS Compliance

Directive (2011/65/EU)

The Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances (RoHS) in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) Directive (2011/65/EU) was transposed into UK law on 2 January 2013.

This legislation bans the placing on the EU market of new EEE containing more than the agreed levels of Lead (Pb), Cadmium (Cd), Mercury (Hg), Hexavalent Chromium (Cr6+), Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB) and Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE).

Metamark informs that the formulation of its products does not contain any substances above the ceiling concentration mentioned in Annex II of the delegated directive (EU) 2015/863 (RoHS-directive, status: March 31, 2015) and is therefore fully compliant with the terms.

However it is not always possible to preclude low level raw material or film contamination of substances included in Annex II of the delegated directive (EU) 2015/863 (RoHS-directive, status: March 31, 2015) and this might result in films containing such substances at trace level. Analysis of such substances does not necessarily form part of our quality control system.
